I am K. Manikyam hailing from Vemuluripadu village. I have two children one son and a daughter. Both are married. My son is having only son who is studying seventh class in the government school. And my daughter is given in marriage to a man who is from another village namely Munagapadu. She is having two daughters namely Parvathi and Madhavi. Parvathi who is elder one dropped out of school while studying 6<sup>th</sup> standard and Madhavi the second daughter is studying 5<sup>th</sup> class in the school at Vemuluripadu village. Parvathi dropped from school because the girl was taken to her parents living at Munagapadu. Her parents are agriculture coolie workers. I went to Munagapadu to see my daughter and son-in-law. There I happened to see Parvathi left out by her parents at

home not going to school. I saw The girl was roaming around neighboring houses. So I brought my granddaughter Parvathi to Vemuluripadu and joined in the Government school of Ameenabad with help of VRO volunteer in February 2021. In the beginning the girl resisted to rejoin school out of fear of backlog but the Community Worker Ms. Sujatha who knew the child very well motivated and encouraged her and helped her in rejoining the school. The parents of Parvathi felt very happy when they came to know that their daughter joined again the school. So I thank VRO and Community Worker for facilitating Parvathi to rejoin school.
